## Tom's Humour Page

Phillip E. "Skipper" Young, a graduate of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, founded Titleist in 1932. When playing a round of golf with his dentist, Young missed a sure putt that seemed to be caused by the weight of the ball. He then asked his dentist friend to X-ray the ball and the film showed that the rubber core was off center. After this initial discovery, Young took X-rays of more golf balls and found that most were poorly constructed with offcenter cores and prone to erratic shots. This inspired Young to produce his own line of golf balls, which would become known as Titleist. 1930: Young developed a machine that could uniformly wind rubber string around a rubber core, making a "dead center" golf ball. He named the ball "Titleist," noting it was the "winner" of the quest to create the best for the game. 1935: The golf division of the Acushnet Process Company produced the Titleist golf ball which had consistently been the company's most successful product. 1948: Introduced "Dynamite Thread" to increase the yardage of their balls. 1949: Titleist became the most used ball at the U.S. Open Tournament.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to report that we applied for and received COVID wage subsidies from the federal government in the amount of \$11,564.60 for the months of November, December, January and February. We are eligible to continue to receive these subsidies until May 2022. This funding was extremely helpful in paying some of our operational bills during our shutdowns and capacity restrictions due to COVID.

More great news!! We were successful in our application for funding with the “New Horizons for Seniors” grant in the amount of \$24,846.00

We will be using these funds for the following 5 projects at the branch:

1. Replacement lighting in Halls A&B. This will complete our relighting project in the entire building with energy efficient and dimmable lighting throughout.
2. New larger TVs in the lounge. Some of our existing TV monitors are too small and 12 years old and nearing the end of their life cycle.
3. New Steam table. This will allow us to hold food events in all 3 of our rooms at the same time. The other 2 steam tables are nearing the end of their lifecycle.
4. Replacement window tinting in Halls A&B. This will block the strong sunlight from entering the building during afternoon events.
5. Upgrades to our existing security camera monitoring system. Our existing security cameras are 12 years old and some need replacement and relocation. This will greatly enhance our building and parking lot security monitoring.

We have also applied for and received a \$10,000 grant from the Ontario government as part of the COVID Small Business Relief program.

A big thank you to our federal and provincial governments for assisting us financially with all of these programs.

## PROPERTY

Our AED has a new 5-year battery, but the pads are on backorder. Br 12, President Jim Blazek, has loaned us theirs until we get ours up and running. Many thanks to Branch 644!

1. Some members of the Lawn and Gardening Committee/ Volunteers walked around the outdoor property area to determine what needed to be done this year in kicking off the gardening and maintenance season. Those members attending: Janet Ciurysek, Larry Williams in charge of indoor and outdoor maintenance, Jim McGhie (Treasurer and Volunteer), Morris Brause, Sue Robinson, Tom Friesen (President), and Randy Soulliere (volunteer).
2. These are the key items that were identified and need to be worked on:
  - a. **Front yard:** all bushes and trees need to be trimmed; large trees need to be cut back away from roads and signs, mulch all gardens again, trim suckers coming up around the base of trees, pull up more sod around and between the sewage ground covers and fill in with mulch, take out some of the bushes that have dead parts and be prepared to replace with other items. Need to see if the ditch area in front of the building can have a controlled burn-out or cleaned up by the municipality. This should be done as part of us paying taxes. The silhouette soldier by the monument needs to be repainted. Larry had suggested and we agreed that we should price out the cost of putting up a low-level white plastic picket fence around our fronts gardens on the east side of the entrance of our building where we have the handicap parking spaces to keep people from walking through the gardens.

- b. **South side of building:** most bushes either need trimming and some need to be taken out due to dead parts or thinned out, need to dig out other wild bushes that have grown in around good bushes that will stay, need to determine what planting can be done with bushes/ plants that are hardy in very dry-full sunshine spots, needs to be re-mulched.
- c. **Hall B Patio Garden:** trim the top of cedars and possibly thin out, trim bushes, look at rebuilding or replacing old picnic tables, possibly putting in some LED lights around the fencing area by the patio, cut back some of the grass plants as they have some dead parts in the plants, cement on patio needs to be power washed.
- d. **East Side Garden along the back of the building:** thin/ trim the bushes, cut back the tree by the Cadet back door entrance, remove the oil container and put back beside the recycling bins, remove the patio stones and put centre of back of the building for a sitting/ smoking area for the kitchen and bar staff, plant some bushes nearer to the entrance of the back door kitchen area, trim the top of the cedars by the enclosed garbage bin container on the north side of the lot, gardens need to be re-mulched.
- e. **North side of building:** thin out bushes and trim remainder in the garden by the bar patio, identify trees along the property line and coordinate with neighbour to get permission to cut down dead ones, trim trees, and cut away suckers around the trees, plant some low- lying plants like hostas and bushes where the big cedars had been taken out of the garden beside the patio, gardens need to be re-mulched, build a permanent gravel or cement pathway from the patio to the grass area to access the picnic table area to ensure we do not have a tripping problem, re-mulch around the large trees on the north side of the building.
- f. **Cover for the patio:** The Treasurer continues to apply for a grant to put up a permanent structure above the patio for outdoor use to provide shade from the sun, rain, etc.
- g. **Patio Furniture:** inspect and repair any patio furniture and ensure that the umbrellas are in good shape. Until the permanent structure is built above this patio, review and cost what could be used in the interim basis.
- h. **Maintenance of Current Equipment:** Larry Williams will take the lead and ask for volunteers as needed to ensure the riding lawn mower, push lawn mower, weed trimmers, etc. are repaired and ready for the season.
- i. **Gardening Tools:** Larry Williams and Morris Brause will review what gardening tools we have and what should be prioritized this season to buy (example: gas or power bush trimmers, pruning shears, more gardening tools, garden wastepaper bags, etc.).
3. **Budget:** Gardening Committee needs to identify the costs for the above and prepare a budget that the Legion Executive can review and then get approval from the membership. There should also be line(s) on the operational budget that the Treasurer will prepare for the new fiscal year and get the membership to approve.
4. **Initial Dates to commence work:** These are the first two dates:
- a. Trim Trees and bushes/ replant or plant some items: Saturday, 2 April 2022, from 9:00 am until noon followed by a BBQ and free drinks for those who volunteer.
- b. Major clean the gardens and possible first cutting of grass and trimming/ weeding: Tuesday, 5 April 2022, from 9:00 am until noon followed by a BBQ for those who volunteer.
5. **Volunteers:** we need to advertise for volunteers that can trim trees and bushes, plants bushes and plants, weed, be willing to take turns cutting the lawn with the riding lawn mower and push lawn mower, help spread mulch. We also need to advertise in our newsletter and on our website.


Craig's kitchen has been taking a lot of bookings for hall rentals in the near future.



Thank you for your continued support of our Cadet Corps.



We were pleased to have 30 participants from Police Service, Police Associations, Military, Fire and Rescue, City Family Services, CMHA, United Way, Military Unit Associations, Legion Service Officers, and Chaplains. We had Councillor Kieran McKenzie from the City of Windsor greet us and compliment the gathering of many organizations in the process of networking to increase the support we give First Responders and their families who suffer from operational stress injuries. He praised the work of Respect Canada and Respect Forum for this national initiative.

Fire Chief Rick Arnel provided a presentation on the importance of networking and taking care of your personnel – the most important resource.

A retired Chaplain, The Reverend (Major – Retired) Kim Gilliland discussed the importance of using Chaplains for all First Responders and ensuring that we understand the importance of spirituality in the process of taking care of our personnel.

Corey Shenken discussed the great programs that the United Way provides, with an emphasis on the counselling program for those who suffer from PTSD, operational stress injuries, and/ or depression.

WO Jeff Morrison from the E&K Scot discussed the program that the military follows with education at all levels, encouraging support to our personnel, conducting after action debriefs after critical incidents, the use of Padres and Social Workers, and the excellent support provided by Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC).

Morris Brause provided a briefing on the history and importance of the Respect Forums in Canada since 2016. He also talked about the importance of the only national mapping chart of those who provide support across Cities, municipalities, regions, provinces and national called the RESPECTMap and the need for all our agencies to put their information on this mapping service.

In the end we broke into four groups and discussed what we were getting from our forums, what we would like to see, and also what organizations still need to come to our meetings. From there, Morris Brause will take that information and recruit more organizations and plan the presentations for the October Forum.
