I have only one resolution: To rediscover the difference between wants and needs. May I have all I need and want all I have!



Why Do We Wear a Poppy? Why Do We Remember?

On November 11th, 1918, gun fires on the Western forefront ceased, signalling the end of World War II for many. However, although the war had ended, the pain did not. Those who lost their loved ones, those who would come to lose their loved ones in future wars, and those who fought and saw their allies die on the battlefield, would still be haunted by the four years' war that took place. To honour them, we wear a red poppy over our hearts, to represent all the blood spilled on the battlefield.

On July 6, 1921, the Royal British Legion adopted the poppy as a symbol for remembrance to be used in the UK, Australia and Canada. Professor Moina Michael started selling poppies to raise funds for soldiers and their families, on November 9, 1918. She chose the poppy because of the poem "In Flanders Fields". The poem by John McCrae speaks of the landscape in which poppies grew where the soldiers had died and would be buried. The red poppy stood out to symbolize the bloodshed in battle. In 1921, Anna Guérin sold poppies in London. Both women campaigned to have the poppy adopted as the official symbol of those who had fallen in the war. On May 15, 1921, the Royal British Legion was formed. Then on November 11, 1921, poppies were sold by the Legion. They sold out raising over 106,000 Euros.

To many of us, wearing a poppy may not seem like a significant thing. After all, what does it do to help? Although it cannot take back the suffering many Canadians went through, it can support those who are suffering and who have suffered. We wear a poppy to give our thanks, to let the veterans who fought for us know that their sacrifices are recognized and that we support and want to give back to the veterans who fought for our freedom and peace.

To this day, poppies are still sold and worn over our hearts. Wars did not end, soldiers still fight, veterans are still affected, families are still mourning, and we can still support them. We can still buy a poppy, make a donation, and lift a load off those family's shoulders financially. Even if we cannot end the wars, we can support the ones who fight to end them and who are affected by them.

All of this on top of inflation and of course due to the increase in minimum wages which have had a 25% increase over the last several months. We have taken a lot of time to study these increases and how they impact our operations and have taken great care to keep these increases to a minimum.

We do appreciate all our members and visitors to our branch, and we look forward to seeing you in the branch.


