The 2023 Poster and Literary contest entry deadline was November 15th. 94 entries were received from 9 of our 28 schools. Poster and Literary contest submissions have been received. The entries were posted Nov 27-30 for judging. Winners will be determined based on national contest guidelines. Final selection is made by the committee.

93 entries received this year. Up from 48 last year. 9 of our 28 schools had entries. 34 entries from Glenwood alone!

Entries received by category: 9 Primary entries K-Gr 3, 60 Junior entries (Gr 4-5-6), 11 Intermediate entries (Gr 7-8-9) and 14 Senior entries (Gr 10-11-12)

The top 3 entries in each category will receive cash prizes (\$1,190 from Poppy Trust Fund), a certificate, and are entered into the Zone competition.

The Zone A1 Public Speaking competition contest will be introduced to our 28 schools this month. The competition will be held at our Branch (594) and is scheduled for Saturday March 2nd, 2024. Divisions are Gr 1-3, Gr 4-6, Gr 7-9 and Gr 10-12.


