CONSTITUTION AND LAWS

We are pleased to advise everyone that we have been notified by Ontario Command on March 11, 2024 that our Amended Branch Regulations have been approved.

The Newly Amended Branch Regulations are posted in the Main Hallway.

The major changes in the Amended Branch Regulations are:

- 1. There will be no more Advanced Polls for Branch Elections.
- 2. The Branch Annual General Meeting and Elections will be held on the 4th Sunday in May starting at 2 pm. (Note: The Date for this year's meeting is May 26, 2024)

I would also like to remind everyone that our Branch Nominations will be held at our General Meeting April 23, 2024, at 7 pm.

In order to be Nominated to Hold Office please see the Qualifications per the General By-Laws:

ARTICLE IV – QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND HOLD OFFICE

401. Only Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting Members in good standing shall have the right to vote and hold Office in their Branch.

- 402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.
- 403. A voting member will be required to serve at least one (1) term on a Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected as President or Vice-President.
- 404. (1) A voting member will be required to have been a member of a Branch for a period for at least one (1) year prior to the date of election to be eligible to be elected to the Branch Executive Committee.

1004. No voting Member may be nominated for an Office unless they are present or have signified in writing their willingness to accept such Office. (The letter must indicate what positions that you are willing to stand for. It must be received by the Branch prior to the April nomination meeting).

PLEASE NOTE THAT NOMINATIONS WILL NOT BE REOPENED AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING/ELECTION MEETING ON MAY 26, 2024.

YOU MUST BE NOMINATED FOR EACH POSITION YOU ARE WILLING TO STAND FOR ELECTION.

YOU CAN ONLY BE ELECTED TO ONE POSITION THAT WILL BE THE MOST SENIOR POSITION YOU WERE ELECTED TO.

New Horizons For Seniors Grant

We were successful in our recent application for funding under the New Horizons for Seniors grant program. We received a total of \$14,482.00 in funding from the federal government to complete five projects at the branch as follows:

- 1. Re-cover 60 chairs and bar stools that are ripped and in need of repair.
- 2. Purchase 12 replacement 6' folding tables.
- 3. Purchase shelving units to store decorations and supplies.
- 4. Purchase replacement patio furniture and umbrella stands.
- 5. Upgrade security camera system.

These are not glamorous projects but just regular wear and tear replacement issues that the branch would have to pay for if we didn't get funding from this grant program.

We are very grateful to the New Horizons for Seniors program for once again approving our request for funding.

Update provided by Comrade Veronica Friesen

I am happy to report that as of March 26th Br. 594 Bingo Volunteer Committee consists of 16 trained people. We have received our first bingo schedule from Power Play Gaming Centre (PPGC) for the months of April, May, and June (7 bingos in all) and despite a few hiccups, a shared google sheets has been created to allow all volunteers to sign up for a date/time, electronically and in real-time, so all participants can see.

Our bingos begin April 12 and the next step in the process is to obtain Legion "uniforms" (golf shirts) for each volunteer to wear while working their shift at the bingo. The cost of these golf shirts will eventually be taken out of bingo revenue but initially will have to be paid for from the general bank

account. Once revenue begins to flow, a transfer of funds will be done to reconcile the general account of this cost. The volunteers will be required to wear their golf shirt, black slacks (no jeans) and black shoes (black running shoes are okay, but not white running shoes and no sandals) while working their shift.

It has been decided to order the same style of black golf shirt and using the same Branch logo stating "PROUDLY SERVING THOSE WHO SERVED" to remain consistent with the current style of golf shirt and logo the Branch uses now. Each shirt will also have the name of the volunteer embroidered on it as required by PPGC.






