CONSTITUTION AND LAWS

We are pleased to advise everyone that we have been notified by Ontario Command on March 11, 2024

that our Amended Branch Regulations have been approved.

The Newly Amended Branch Regulations are posted in the Main Hallway.

The major changes in the Amended Branch Regulations are:

- 1. There will be no more Advanced Polls for Branch Elections.
- 2. The Branch Annual General Meeting and Elections will be held on the 4th Sunday in May starting at 2 pm. (Note: The Date for this year's meeting is May 26, 2024)

I would also like to remind everyone that our Branch Nominations will be held at our General Meeting April 23, 2024, at 7 pm.

In order to be Nominated to Hold Office please see the Qualifications per the Legion General By-Laws:

ARTICLE IV - QUALIFICATION TO VOTE AND HOLD OFFICE

- 401. Only Ordinary, Life, Associate, and Affiliate-Voting Members in good standing shall have the right to vote and hold Office in their Branch.
- 402. A voting Member, to be eligible for election to any Branch Office, must be in good standing for the year in which the election is held.
- 403. A voting member will be required to serve at least one (1) term on a Branch Executive Committee to be eligible to be elected as President or Vice-President.
- 404. (1) A voting member will be required to have been a member of a Branch for a period for at least one (1) year prior to the date of election to be eligible to be elected to the Branch Executive Committee.
- 1004. No voting Member may be nominated for an Office unless they are present or have signified in writing their willingness to accept such Office. (The letter must indicate what positions that you are willing to stand for. It must be received by the Branch prior to the April nomination meeting).

PLEASE NOTE THAT NOMINATIONS WILL NOT BE REOPENED AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING/ELECTION MEETING ON MAY 26, 2024.

YOU MUST BE NOMINATED FOR EACH POSITION YOU ARE WILLING TO STAND FOR ELECTION.

YOU CAN ONLY BE ELECTED TO ONE POSITION THAT WILL BE THE MOST SENIOR POSITION YOU WERE ELECTED TO.

VETERANS SERVICES

The following is part of OUR Branches District A Convention Report soon available at the branch.

"Operation Leave the Streets Behind" has aided 1,187 homeless or near homeless Veterans since 2009. The Ontario Legion Branches in District A have provided \$232,282.43 to support this program.

199 Ontario communities have received support for: rental payments, utilities payments, food vouchers, store vouchers, transportation support, medical expenses, moving expenses, and other similar expenses. Mental health and counselling have also greatly benefited our Veterans who have found themselves in dire need of support.

All Veteran members are strongly encouraged to apply for their NDI-75 Veteran Service Identification card. This care is intended to identify former CAF members, acknowledge their service, and recognize their enduring affiliation with the Canadian Forces family. Spouses of Veterans should apply for CF1 cards.

CLASS ACTION SETTLEMENT: On March 19th, 2024, the Government of Canada has agreed to settle the class action lawsuit. Later this year Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) will automatically provide settlements to Veterans receiving disability pensions. Estates, family members of deceased Class Members and other Class Members who do not currently receive disability pensions directly from VAC will be required to submit a Claim by March 19th. 2025. Claims can be submitted at the administrator's website: veteranspensionsettlement.kpmg.ca or on the French website: veteranspensionreglement.kpmg.ca.

A dedicated call centre has been established to address general inquiries: 1-833–839–0648.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Unfortunately, the Branch had a slight financial loss for the month of March.

The bar operation has been performing well; in March, it saw record gross sales.

Unfortunately, again, we had a lot of expenses during the month, creating the loss the Branch had to endure. (note the Kitchen revenue received in March is for February sales so it does not include St Patrick's day or Good Friday this year)

New Horizons For Seniors Grant

We were successful in our recent application for funding under the New Horizons for Seniors grant program. We have now received a total of \$14,482.00 in funding this year from the federal government to complete five projects at the branch as follows:

- 2. Purchase 12 replacement 6' folding tables.
- 3. Purchase shelving units to store decorations and supplies.
- 4. Purchase replacement patio furniture and umbrella stands.
- 5. Upgrade security camera system.

These are not glamorous projects but just regular wear and tear replacement issues that the branch would have to pay for if we didn't get funding from this grant program.

We are very grateful to the New Horizons for Seniors program for once again approving our request for funding.




