# PRESIDENTS REPORT



Happy New Year Everyone!

From a business standpoint, 2025 was the most successful year we have ever had here at Branch 594! Our bar sales, event bookings and kitchen revenue were all extremely strong throughout 2025. Through our fundraising initiatives, we were able to deposit the sum of \$40,000.00 into our branch building fund which will be used for future building repairs and maintenance projects.

Our membership continues to grow, and we now have over 600 members!

A huge thank you to all of our dedicated volunteers who give freely of their time to continue the Legion's mission of serving our Veterans and their families, to promote Remembrance and to serve our communities and country.

The revenue that we receive from our Bingo's at the Powerplay Gaming Centre is having a major impact on the community and our branch finances. In 2025 we were able to donate a total of \$42,700.00 to local sports teams and community not for profit groups. In addition, Bingo revenue was also used to pay for some Community/Veteran events totalling \$7,744.00 as well as \$10,234.00 for building maintenance and repairs this year. Thanks to all of our Bingo volunteers for your continued dedication.

The final figures are now in from our annual Poppy campaign. I am very pleased and proud to report that we raised a total of \$79,032.00 which is more than last year's campaign with fewer day this year! Well done and thank you to all of our Poppy canvassers and volunteers. These funds will make a big difference in the lives of our Veterans as well as the community.

As we begin 2026, we look forward to another prosperous and successful year here at Branch 594. Thank you to all of our members and guests for your continued patronage to keep our Legion strong.

All garden hoses have been removed from outside and stored in the garage

- The control knob on the tilt kettle was not working, and we are working on getting the info on this asap.

Temperate Controls have notified us that as of January 1<sup>st</sup>, the owners are retiring and business is closing. They will finish up any repairs that have come up beforehand.

We are putting together a Request For Proposal to find another company that can provide us with a preventative maintenance program as well as repair our equipment as needed.

## Royal Canadian Legion Branch 594 in the Community

The abridged mission statement of the Royal Canadian Legion is to Serve Veterans, to Promote Remembrance, and to SERVE OUR COMMUNITIES. Allow me to say that again “to Serve our Communities”.

Metropolitan Branch 594 of the Royal Canadian Legion is situated at a crossroads of sorts, located geographically in Tecumseh, but bordering on LaSalle, Windsor, and Amherstburg. Our community outreach touches all four of these municipalities.

How does the Legion serve the community? It serves in several ways. For Example, we have a very active Seniors group which holds dinner dances every Monday. In the month of December, our Seniors group made a very substantial donation to the LaSalle food bank. Monies raised at the seniors dances are funneled back into the community in many other ways as well. Our Ways and Means committee holds “All You Can Eat Spaghetti Dinners” every second Tuesday raising funds which are used to support Legion activities. Our Legion volunteers work Bingos to raise money which we then donate to several local charity organizations. We recently donated to Knobby’s Kids, the Windsor Essex Therapeutic Riding Association, The Downtown Mission and the Windsor Youth Center. That was just in December.

Money raised during our annual Poppy Campaign is used to fund an Art and Literary competition where we ask student in schools to draw artwork, write essays and poems about the importance of remembrance. The top three Branch winners of the competition are awarded cash prizes and go on to Zone A1 (All students in LaSalle Windsor & Tecumseh), District A (Southwestern Ontario), Provincial, and National competition. Certificates and cash prizes (increasing in value at each step) are awarded to winners at each level. The Poppy fund also is used to award educational bursaries to qualified applicants for post secondary education.

As you can see, the Legion does not exist in a bubble. We are very active in our community. The activities listed above are just the tip of the iceberg.

St. Joseph's Veterans Care Program (VCP) provides long-term care (LTC) and outpatient services to eligible individuals. Veterans Affairs Canada decides who is eligible for our programs and services

### **Long Term Care at Parkwood Institute:**

The VCP provides LTC for Canadian War veterans and members of certain civilian groups. Most of our resident veterans served in World War II and/or the Korean War. Complex medical care is also available for resident veterans. Respite care (short-term stays) is available for those who are eligible.

There are 141 beds in the VCP at Parkwood Institute across three units. Many of our resident veterans have complex medical conditions such

as dementia, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), heart failure, chronic kidney disease, problems swallowing and cancer.

When they move in, residents are matched with the care unit best suited to their physical, emotional and social needs. We treat each resident with dignity and respect and provide opportunities for them to live their best life. Learn more about our [resident services](#).
